

Too Good to be True


Dr. Jeanie Muller is a cardiologist who rode for several years at Portugese Bend Riding Club on her beloved American Saddlebred mare, Samba. Samba died from colic complications in 2022 at 25 years of age. Jeanie sought another horse to continue her journey. Her search led her to Ruger, a cute AQHA bay gelding. Dr. Muller was offered another position in Cardiology outside of Sacramento, and a dilemma arose concerning full time work and the needs of her new horse. Enter Julie. Julie is an energetic, sincerely funny 61 yo woman who has been surrounded by horses since she was conceived. Her dad was a farrier in Lake County and helped develop the horse trails in Highland Springs. Over the years, Julie became a 'horse mom' to a lovely young person named Maddie. Their relationship was strong and horse-centered. On a summer day outside the barn, Maddie witnessed Julie have a cardiac arrest. They were alone. Maddie called 911, started CPR, and after 9 minutes of CPR, EMTs arrived to defibrillate Julie. Julie awoke and immediately began a verbal barrage of questions: "What happened? Why are you guys here? Why does my chest hurt so much?"

There are 300,000 sudden deaths per year in the USA. Less than 10% of cardiac arrests occurring outside the hospital meet with a successful outcome. Julie was one of the lucky ones. And Maddie's CPR made the difference.

Fast forward one year. As gratitude to Maddie, Julie wanted to purchase Maddie her very own horse—something Maddie had only dreamed of. What are the chances of a cardiologist selling a horse to a cardiac arrest survivor, to be given as a gift, to a beautiful young woman who saved a life by performing effective CPR? And by the way, Ruger has a new name: Doc.

LBMP was initially started by businessmen in 1935 to support the Long Beach Police Dept. We are a highly active parade and educational organization, who have enjoyed the privilege and honor of participating in the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade for the past 70 plus years, beginning in 1947.

Our local LA County Sheriff's Department Posse is run out of the Lomita Station, located on Narbonne Avenue.

The Sheriff's Posse is a county wide organization. We band together several times a year for training, patrols, trail rides, community outreach, and generally fun times. As a countywide department we also come together to do parades, search and rescue details, crowd control, patrol the LA river and other areas that are accessible only by foot or by horse, and so much more.

The training is unbelievable! I never thought I would be doing the things that the Posse training has afforded me.

Everyone needs a purpose to have a feeling of well being. Horses, as well as dogs, are no exception. They need a job, they need a purpose to be happy. The posse does that for you and your horse. My horse, Zena, knows when she is on duty, whether it is doing a patrol at the shopping center handing out treats to the kids who flock to pet her, or standing her ground in line with her teammates holding a crowd at bay. She can be a warrior when we need to be and a gentle kind soul when the little civilians are around her.

The Posse is heavily into community involvement and preserving the horse community as well. We do several trail patrols each month. During these patrols we are the eyes and ears of the Sheriff's Department. We are there to let the "would be" problem folks know to think twice before messing with our community.




