



This inaugural event is just the beginning for the ESC Gymkhana Series. Stay tuned for more action-packed, youth-focused fun in the saddle!



Need a Cowboy Hat? Go See Carlos Ramirez at LPK Hats!

We have a new Cowboy clothing and accessories store in town! Owned and operated by Carlos Ramirez, LPK Hats can take care of all your western wear needs in one place.

I spoke to Carlos at his shop recently after seeing him at the Empty Saddle Club Gymkhana Series Show in March. He had many beautiful hats and bands for sale there along with his steaming machine for immediate hat shaping. I was intrigued about his business as well as interested in helping to promote a horse related business in our neighborhood.

When I asked Carlos what gave him the idea to open a Cowboy Hat Shop, this is what I learned; It all started with a Stetson hat Carlos purchased when he was about 21. One day he noticed it was crooked. He took it to a local western wear store to get it reshaped and straightened out, but they couldn't fix it. He set the hat aside and years passed without him wearing it, until his father purchased a Stetson hat of his own. When his father's hat got stained, Carlos went on the hunt for someone who could clean and restore it to wearable condition. At one point he was referred to 3G Hat Shaping in Whittier and that's where Carlos got his inspiration to learn how to shape and maintain Cowboy hats.

After that encounter, Carlos bought a hat steamer from Amazon. At first, he only considered hat shaping as a hobby. As he learned more and more about shaping and trimming hats by watching YouTube videos and trial and error, he began shaping hats for friends and family. Little by little, word spread about Carlos' beautiful hats, until he had enough clients to consider opening his own hat shaping business. At first, he was only looking to rent a small workspace because

the hats were overtaking his home. As luck would have it, he met Sherry from Cheap Vintage and she offered to lease him a whole storefront right next door to hers on Narbonne Avenue.

Some of the services Carlos currently offers are; felt and straw hat sales, felt hat maintenance, brim cutting and reshaping, crown reshaping (felt only), custom shaped hats, hat cleaning, hat and belt accessories, sweat band replacement, and special order horse tack. He also carries formal and casual ready-made shirts, pants, and jackets as well as a line of beautiful custom-made boots. His goal is to become a one stop shop for semi-bespoke hats, boots, and western wear where quality is his number one priority.

Located at 25410 Narbonne Avenue in Lomita, LPK is very conveniently located to most of us. The hours are a little unconventional as Carlos still works full-time at SpaceX, but for now, you can find him at the store Tuesday through Thursday from 6pm to 9pm, Friday from 6pm to 10pm, and Saturday from 9am to 2pm and 5pm to 7pm. Sunday he's closed except by appointment. Stop by and visit Carlos at his shop where you'll be greeted with a smile, a free drink, and all the help you need to create a great western look of your own.


