

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

Landfill Trail Closed to Dogs

From the city:

Effective immediately, the Landfill Trail is temporarily closed to all dogs. Warnings to stay on the perimeter trails and keep dogs on leashes have been disregarded, and as a result, LA County Sanitation has decided to temporarily close the Landfill to all dogs as they develop an enforcement plan. As of this update, equestrians still have access to the trail, but it is important to be mindful of all PV Landfill rules. All equestrian riders and walkers may not access unauthorized trails. Please share this message to ensure all who use the Landfill know what needs to be done to maintain our access to the trail. Equestrians can enter the landfill through Peter Weber Equestrian Center for the time being.

April Meeting Recap

The PVPHA April Meeting with Will Friday of Performance Equine Bodywork & Nutrition was a huge success! This well attended meeting was jampacked with great information on understanding equine nutrition and supplements.

As you may know, Will Friday is a practitioner and instructor of the Masterson Method of equine bodywork. As such he was looking for natural ways to support the health and recovery of horses, and so began his educational journey into horse nutrition. This included courses at Pierce College in Woodland Hills, which is well known for its agricultural science pathway, working with a wide array of PhD's in the field of horse nutrition, reading scientific books on the subject, attending workshops, listening to podcasts like Feed Room Chemist, and any other reliable sources of information he could find.

Will's primary goal for horse owners is to simplify their feeding program while increasing their horse's performance. To that end, Will shared a very comprehensive Power Point presentation that covered a wide range of topics.

We learned that when making nutritional decisions there are a number of important questions that must be considered. These include information about the horse, what it's current diet consists of, and what your goals for the horse are. Will pointed out that a great way to gauge your horse's condition is to weigh and photograph them monthly (weight tapes for estimating the weight of a horse are available at most feed stores and online).

The presentation included information on the calorie needs of a horse depending on the amount of work it is doing, what a horse's nutritional needs are, and how to determine your horse's body condition score. Will also talked

about different types of hay and key concepts like moisture content, Neutral Detergent Fiber, Acid Detergent Fiber, and crude protein, as well as how and when to feed. Supplements, ration balancers, concentrated feeds, complete feeds, senior feeds, and mare and foal feeds were then explained and compared. We learned how to read feed and supplement labels and what to look for and what to avoid. Will discussed the difference between structural carbohydrates (fiber) and non-structural carbohydrates (sugars, starch, fructans, etc.) and how the amounts of these are affected by the type and maturity of the hay. We learned about the micro and macro mineral needs of horses, vitamins, fats and Omega 3,6 fatty acids, pre and probiotics, beet pulp, rice bran, copra, granola feeds, and amino acids.

Did you know that of the nine amino acids only three of them are considered "essential amino acids"? Will explained that a horse only needs to consume those three and the remainder are synthesized in the horse's gut. Therefore, it is very important that a horse receives an adequate amount of those three amino acids in their diet. The three essential or "limiting" amino acids are Lysine, Methionine, and Threonine.

Finally, Will reminded us about the importance of taking care when changing feeds.

Any feed changes (forage included) should be made gradually over a 2-4 week period which allows the gut microbiome to adjust to the new feed and reduces incidence of colic and gastric upset.

Visible changes in horse's condition will take a minimum of 60-90 days to occur. Other changes, such as hoof quality, may take longer and will be harder to track.

Make any feed or forage change gradually, across a period of 2-4 weeks by mixing your old feed or forage with the new, gradually increasing the new product and decreasing the old.

Set reminders to document weight and body condition score, and take photos to evaluate changes.
